Reference is made to your Freedom of Information-Privacy Acts (FOIPA) request dated October 3, 2000, pertaining to a statement filed by you, dated April of 1995.

Based on the information furnished, a search of the automated indices to the central records system maintained in the Newark Office located no record responsive to your request.

The FBI Records Retention Plan and Disposition Schedules have been approved by the United States District Court for the District of Columbia and are monitored by representatives of the National Archives and Records Administration.
